# Mr. Lewis Turner Wiggins, Sr.

## *A Time To Be Born (Ecclesiastes 3:2)*

Mr. Lewis T. Wiggins was born in South Carolina on September 18, 1944 to the late Stiner Wiggins, Sr. and Elizabeth (Williams) Wiggins. He was the first born of seven siblings.

## *A Time To Live (Matthew 4:4)*

Brother Lewis grew up in Keysville, Georgia. He attended grammar school at Palmer Elementary from 1st through 8th grade. A year following, he completed the 9th grade at Gough Elementary. Later in 1964, he graduated from Waynesboro-Industrial High School.

On January 15, 1966, he married Ada (Brown) Wiggins, to their union, two children were born.

Lewis began his Christian journey by attending First Baptist Church in Keysville GA. It was there, that he was baptized as a young boy. On February 17, 1980, at Waynesboro Deliverance Evangelistic Church, he rededicated his life to God. Later in 2014, he joined Greater Allen A.M.E. Cathedral of New York.

Lewis was funny and had a great sense of humor. He enjoyed telling jokes and making others laugh. He was a comedian at heart. To add, Lewis loved fishing, hunting, and cooking on the grill, but didn't like the cleanup part afterwards. He also enjoyed eating wild meat such as; deer, rabbits, and raccoons. He had an outpouring of compassion for others. He was a beloved father to his children. His heart was enormous. There was not a time during his travels that he failed to treat his family and friends out to eat, all at his expense. This was one of the ways he displayed love for others.

## *A Time To Serve (Psalm 100:2)*

During Lewis's Senior Year in 1963, he worked his first job at the N.C.O Club located on Fort Gordon, GA. There, he served as a dishwasher and busted tables. After graduation in 1964, for a short time, he worked for a Moving Service on Twigg Street in Augusta, GA. Later, he became a dedicated employee at Babcock & Wilcox Factory for a few years.

In 1967, with some convincing from Aunt Julia, Lewis decided to relocate to New York for a better life. Once there, he worked as a valet parker for many years. At night he was a janitorial worker at a local library and an Army recruitment office. Later, he met Joe. Joe taught Lewis the skills of roofing. Lewis worked for Joe many years. His dedicated work ethics led him to become a business partner. Not many years later, Joe sold his business to Lewis and the business was renamed "L. Wiggins Roofing Company." His roofing business was a proven success. As of today, L. Wiggins Roofing Company still operates in New York city.

In 1982, he met Kim Bryan and they would later marry. To their union no children were born. They were together for 37 years.

You've touched so many parts.*



